

We are pleased to announce...

We are now a member of MeLCat, the statewide catalog and interlibrary loan service. MeLCat offers library patrons simple and convenient Web-based access



to a single, collective catalog of participating libraries' holdings.

MeLCat allows library patrons to request materials from a comprehensive catalog that includes the holdings of libraries around the state. Items will be delivered to the library, usually within five business days. MeLCat is available from home, work, school, and the library at http://mel.org. MeLCat provides access to millions of items, including books, music, and movies from public libraries, academic libraries, K-12 libraries and the Library of Michigan. The bibliographic database has nearly 6 million titles. New libraries continue to be added throughout the year.

MeLCat makes it possible for library patrons to reach far beyond the walls of this library to a growing world of remarkable information resources. Simply click on the MeLCat icon and enter your search term (author, title, subject, etc.). When the item you are searching for appears, click on the "get this for me" button. You'll be asked to enter your home library (Hamburg Township Library), your name, and your library card number. We will call you as soon as your item arrives at the library.

Please remember:

- ☐ Children cannot request items through MeLCat. A parent must request for the child.
- ☐ Because these are interloan items, they cannot be renewed. Don't worry, you still have the regular 3 week check-out period.
- ☐ There is still a 10 item per library card limit.
- ☐ MeLCat items returned late have the same overdue fines as regular library
- ☐ Requests cannot be made for items owned by the Hamburg Library.
