

any people love mystery novels, but the kind of M detective story you crave reveals a lot about you. Do you love mysteries that take a surprising twist at the end? People, who prefer less-predictable endings tend to have higher self-esteem than those who like to be able to finger the killer from the very start. Found in a new study conducted at Ohio State University that investigated the popularity of crime stories.

X hat's behind the difference? "Whodunit stories • with foreseeable endings can boost the spirits of people feeling down on themselves," says Silvia Knobloch-Westerwich, Ph.D., assistant professor of communications and coauthor or the study. Even if you usually feel pretty good about yourself, solving a mystery can also lift your spirits when you've just had a bad day. -LHJ


