Library's Butterfly Garden

The Butterfly Garden was planted in the spring of 2016 and serves our butterfly and pollinator population by meeting the needs of these animals at each stage of life. Groundcover and foliage from plants such as Mistflower, Little Bluestem, and Rainbow Chard offer shade, shelter, and protection from predators. Plants in the garden were

specifically chosen as hosts for the butterflies in their larval stage, when hungry caterpillars are busy munching on leaves such as mint, dill, parsley, and Wild Columbine.

Plenty of nectar sources were planted to ensure that adults have an abundance and variety of food such as Coneflower. Bee Balm, and



Soldenrod. With four different milkweed varieties. the Monarch butterfly specifically benefits from the garden, as it sustains the species throughout its life cycle. In fact, the first year the garden bloomed (spring/summer 2016) several Monarch caterpillars were spotted!
