

#### Enchanted Season w/ Lance Parrish

### Detroit at the World's Fairs, 1851-1962

Between 1850 and 1962 Detroit made many significant contributions to multiple World Fairs, even though they never hosted one. Find out more about this and when Detroit started to host a universal exhibition beginning in 1889.

More than 30 lights in Michigan are rumored to be haunted. Join us to learn about some of them.

#### Roy Reuther and the UAW (v)

Thursday, October 9 @ 6:30pm

Join us for an evening to learn about Roy Reuther, brother of labor leader Walter Reuther, and the triumphs and tragedies in the labor and civil rights movement from the 1930s to the 1960s. This program is presented by Roy Reuther's son, Alan Reuther.

#### September 3: Stranger in the Woods by Michael Finkel

In 1986, Christopher Knight vanished into the Maine woods and lived in total isolation for nearly 30 years, surviving by stealth and wit. His 2013 arrest revealed a remarkable story of solitude, survival, and the deeper meaning of a life lived apart from society.

#### October 1: The Huntress by Kate Quinn
